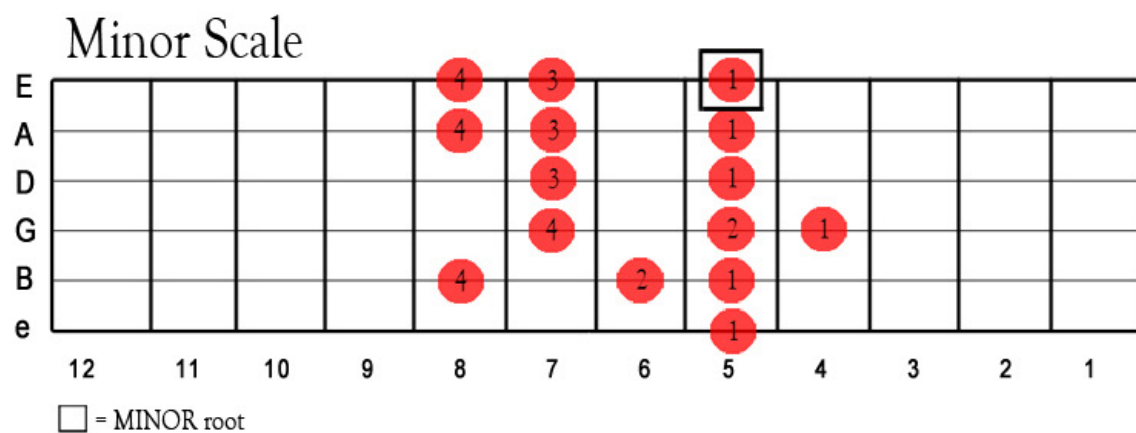




1. The first finger root on this scale is the MINOR root. So if your first finger is on an A, then this scale is an A Minor scale.
2. This is basically the first minor position that you should learn. If you compare this with the pentatonic, they have many of the same notes and can be used the same way. The first finger on the top string is the minor key, and the fourth finger on the top string is the major key. So, if this scale is an A minor scale, that means that your fourth finger would be on a "C" note, so this is also a C major scale. This is simply another way to play a major scale as well. But most guitarists use this as a minor scale, because it is based off of the minor root.



*All charts are charted as looking at my guitar neck in the video (a right handed person sitting in front of you). Fret numbers start right and move left, and the smallest string is on the bottom.*
