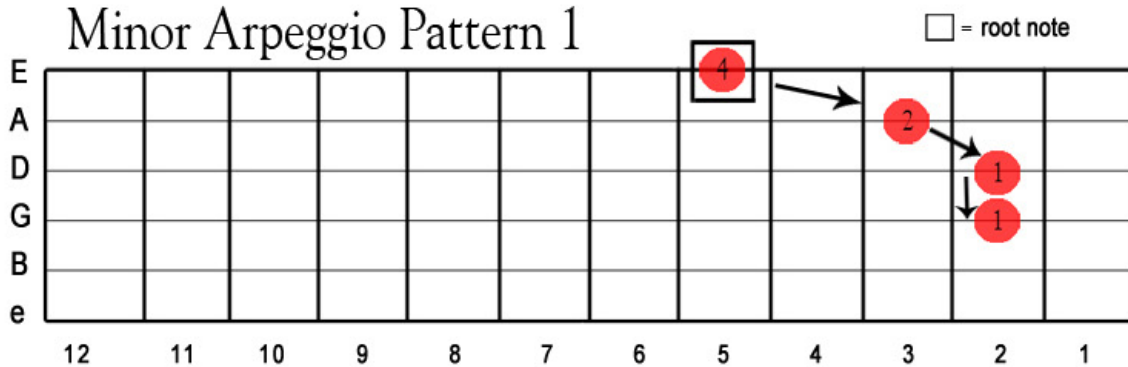


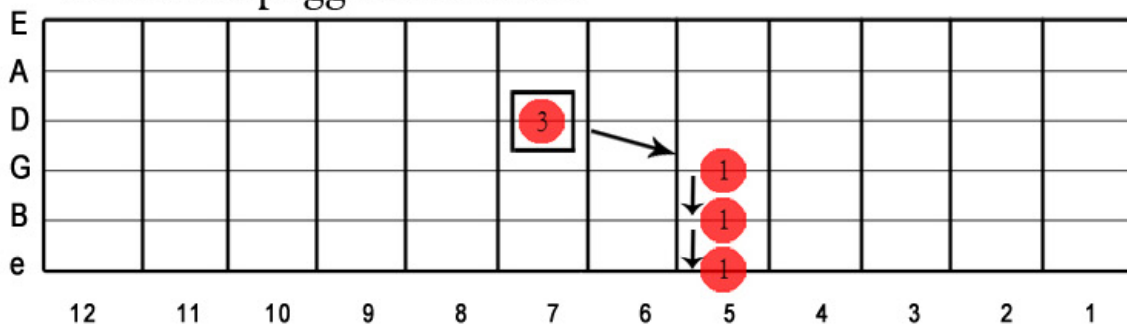


1. Use these charts to better follow the video lesson on simple arpeggios.
2. The fret numbers are marked to show the direction in which to move your fingers through the notes, but you are not confined to those frets. These patterns can be applied all over the guitar neck.
3. The box marks the root note or starting note of the arpeggio. Then follow the arrows in the right direction to play the arpeggio correctly.
4. You can try sweeping these arpeggios. Use these arpeggios inside relative scales like the major and minor scales. You can even try playing these over chords.

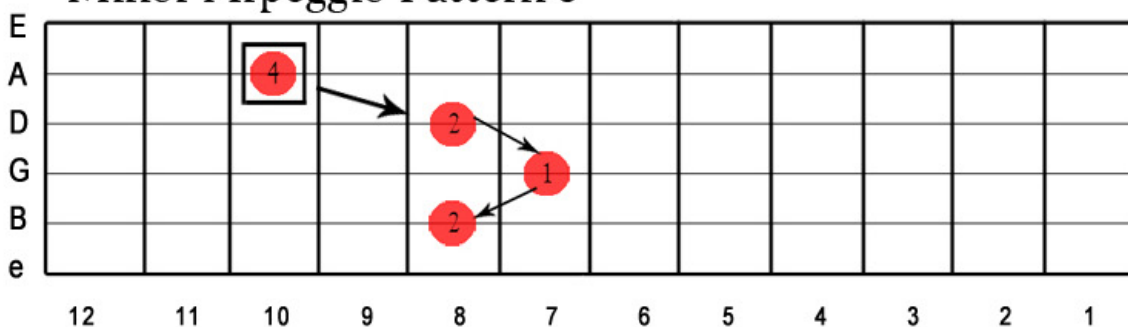
### Minor Arpeggio Pattern 1
